

Workforce Trends

Population

The Boise metropolitan area encompasses Ada, Boise, Canyon, Gem and Owyhee counties. The area covers 11,738 square miles, 14.2 percent of the state, and varies from high desert to beautiful forests on rugged mountains to deep river canyons. Over 41 percent of Idahoans live in the metro area. It also holds the state's capital, Boise.

While population growth was as slow as 1.1 percent per year immediately following the recession, the growth rate has increased and now the area ranks in the top 50 fastest growing metro areas nationally. Population growth continued to increase between 2014 and 2015, with a gain of 1.8 percent. This improved growth rate is still considerably below the 2006 rate of 4.3 percent, the highest rate since the early 1990s. Since 2005, the metro area has grown by almost 130,000 or 24 percent. The state's two largest counties—Ada County and Canyon County—contribute 95 percent of the metro area's 676,929 people.




Labor Force & Employment

The Boise metropolitan area's labor force grew by over 10,000 from 2005 to 2006 before slowing considerably in 2007. The labor force began to regain strength in 2010 and is now 42,508—15 percent—above 2005 levels. The unemployment rate also improved to 4.4 percent in 2014, down 1.6 points from the year before.

The area continues to experience a strong recovery and added 9,088 covered jobs in 2015. Construction, which was devastated during the recession, recorded its first year over year gains in 2012 with an increase of almost 600 jobs. This growth has continued through 2015 with the industry adding almost 1,050 more jobs. Manufacturing, another sector that has had a rough decade, continues its year over year growth with an addition of 638 jobs in 2015. The winner for the most jobs added over the decade though goes to private education and health ser-

Unemployment Rates




VICES, with 12,655 new jobs since 2004. From 2014 to 2015, Trade, utilities and transportation saw the most growth, adding 2,200 jobs.

In 2015, mining and manufacturing industries recorded the largest gains in earnings per worker with gains of 12,240 and 10,370 respectively. Only one industry, construction, registered a decline in wages.

Per Capita Income & Employment

The Boise metro area's per capita income continued its climb in 2014 to \$37,991, growing 3.2 percent over the previous year. This put the metro area 3 percent over the state but only 83 percent of national per capita income.

The region's nonfarm employment landscape is led by trade, utilities and transportation making up 20 percent of the areas employment. Professional and business services and education and health services make up the next largest piece with 14 and 15 percent respectively.
