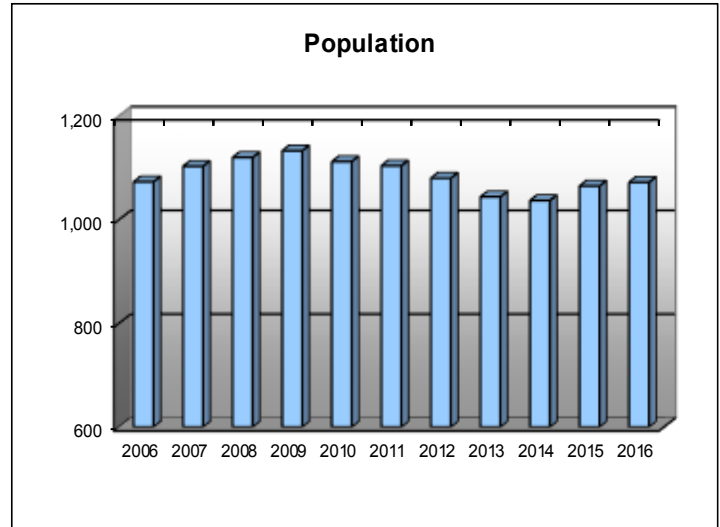

Workforce Trends

Population

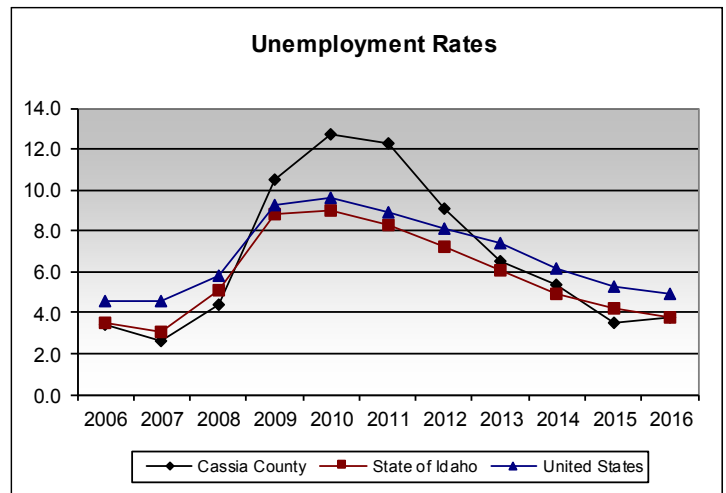
Camas County's population has lost population five out of the last ten years. The 2016 population is an estimated 1,072, up .7 percent. It is the third least-populated county in Idaho but contains some of the most beautiful and rugged scenery. At an elevation of 5,069 feet, Camas County offers recreational opportunities from fishing, hunting, skiing and snowmobiling to camping and golfing. Fairfield, the county seat and only major town with a population of 389, is at the foot of vertical Soldier Mountain with a summit elevation of 7,177 feet. The distance from population centers and the interstate limit its development. Consequently, the outlook is for slow but steady growth over the next decade as tourism in areas such as nearby Sun Valley return to pre-recession levels.



Labor Force & Employment

Seasonally adjusted unemployment in Camas County has been on a roller coaster for the last decade plunging to a record low 2.6 percent in 2007 and then skyrocketing as a result of the national recession to 12.8 percent in 2010. The civilian labor force is so small that minor adjustments translate into wide swings in the rate. The rate has dropped drastically in the last two years.

Most workers are in government, education, agriculture or trade industries. Commuters to Blaine County are common, taking higher-wage jobs in landscaping and construction with seasonal swings following the economy. During the winter, Soldier Mountain Ski Resort employment jumps significantly while demand for

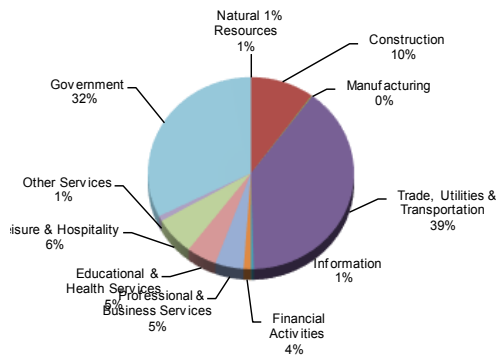


farm labor is high in the summer and fall. The major crops are hay, dry land wheat and barley. Cattle ranches also dot the Camas Prairie. The local economy has diversified somewhat with transportation, manufacturing and service jobs. The future appears to be stable with limited growth. Soldier Mountain Ski Resort was sold in 2012, then again in 2015. Record snowfall this last season caused the hill to close for a day of maintenance.

Wages & Income

Per capita income dropped 4.3 percent in Camas County, driven by non-farm proprietors' income. The county's per capita income ranks 16th amongst the 44 counties. High Country Fusion, a fabricator and distributor of high density polyethylene pipe, is one of the largest private employers in this sparsely populated county. In-migration of retirees drawn by the recreational opportunities and the ability to generate added income from either work at home or self-employment had been a plus for the remote area.

Covered employment grew by 3.1 percent from 2015, mostly in construction. Average wages for all industries declined 3.5 percent from 2015. Professional and Business Services wages grew by 14 percent, an industry that has included lone eagles in the past. Government jobs grew by three percent, dropping from 43 percent in 2001 to 29 percent in 2016. The area's economic health is dependent on a strong economy in the surrounding counties and nationally.
