
Workforce Trends

Population

Idaho County's population grew 3 percent from 15,638 in 2006 to 16,156 in 2016, while U.S. population grew 8 percent and the state's population grew 15 percent.

The relatively slow growth has resulted in the county's population being relatively old. Many of the county's youth leave the area after high school, and are unable to return. Most newcomers to the county are retires from other parts of the Pacific Northwest and California, drawn by the scenic beauty, outdoor recreational opportunities, and rural lifestyle.

The 2016 populations of Idaho County's incorporated cities were 3,139 in Grangeville, 917 in Cottonwood, 651 in Kooskia, 406 in Riggins, 228 in Stites, 161 in Ferdinand, and 91 in White Bird.




Labor Force & Employment

. Idaho County's economy remains heavily dependent on natural resources — both forest products and agriculture. The U.S. Forest Service employs more than 300 people. One in eight of the county's private sector jobs is in logging or wood products manufacturing. Idaho Forest Group in Grangeville employs more than 160 people, making it the county's largest manufacturer.

Other manufacturers have expanded in recent years. Among the larger are Idaho Sewing for Sport and Advanced Welding and Steel in Grangeville, Pacific Cabinets in Ferdinand, and Uhling Products near Cottonwood.

Other large employers include the hospitals in Cottonwood and Grangeville, Seubert Excavators, the Bureau of Land Management in Cottonwood, and the


Although graced by mountains, forests and rivers, the county is just beginning to fully tap its tourism potential. Its lodging, restaurant, and tourist shops have become more sophisticated over the last 20 years.

Aging of the population led the health care sector to grow steadily over the last 10 years. Health care jobs grew from 540 jobs in 2006 to 670 in 2016.
