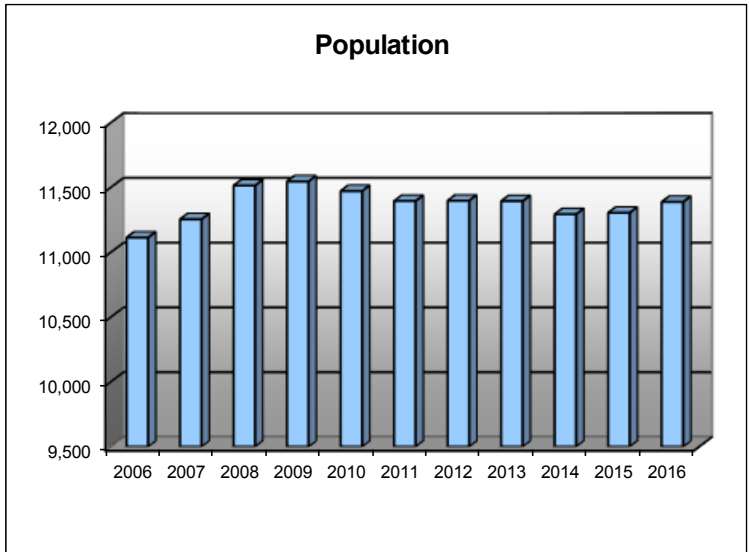

## Workforce Trends

### Population

Owyhee County is the second largest of Idaho's 44 counties by land area. It has one of the lowest population densities in the state, and more than three-quarters of the land is federally owned. Owyhee's population increased 2.5 percent from 2006 to 2016 to 11,389. Population grew relatively quickly leading up to the recession, but has leveled off and even fell slightly since 2008. Due to the large federal land holdings and the fairly remote locations of this largely agricultural county, population growth has been slower than in most surrounding areas. Most residents live along the northern edge of the county.

Homedale, the largest city in the county, has a population of 2,584 in 2016. Marsing, another major city, population is 1,282.

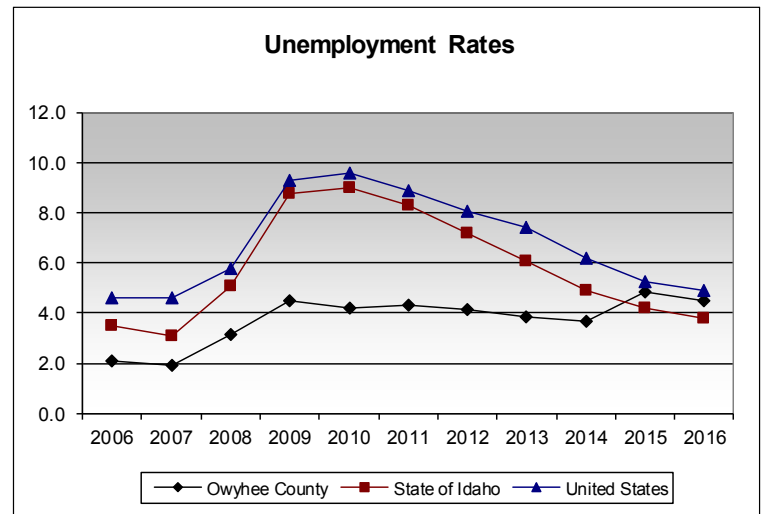


### Labor Force & Employment

The average annual unemployment rate is 4.5 percent, increasing 2.6 percentage points from the 2007 rate of 1.9 percent, a record low. The county maintains one of the state's lowest unemployment rates month to month, primarily due to its high concentration of employment in government and agriculture that remain relatively stable over time.

The labor force has fluctuated throughout the decade reaching its lowest level, 4,328, in 2009. In 2016 the labor force reached a record high with increases in employment. The number of unemployed dipped slightly in 2016 to 244.

Overall, covered employment increased very slightly in 2016, adding only 20 jobs from 2015. The biggest gain occurred in the educational and health services sector from 2015 with 20. Other sectors that experienced job growth were trade, utilities and transportation (19) and



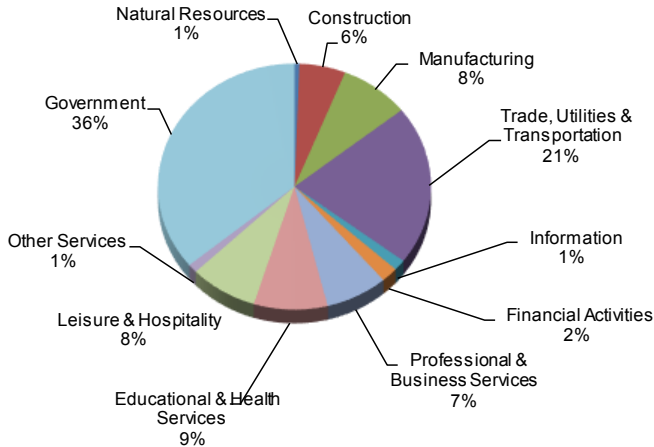
government (16) Agriculture; professional and business services; and manufacturing lost a combined total of 46 jobs.

Over the decade, the number of covered jobs increase 112. The largest increases were in agriculture (228); trade, utilities and transportation (52); and leisure and hospitality and trade, transportation; and education and health services (49). Construction was the big loser with 92 fewer jobs.

### Per Capita Income, Nonfarm Jobs & Wages

Owyhee County ranked 37th in per capita income down from 34th in 2015 with \$32,118 in 2016. Even with an decrease of nearly \$385 the county was 81 percent of the state's average and 65 percent of the national average.

Government makes up the largest portion—37 percent—of nonfarm employment. Trade, utilities and transportation is the second largest at 21 percent.

Covered wages experienced a slight decrease from 2015, up \$280. The good news was that they have increase 26.1 percent, \$6,595, in the last 10 years.
