

Workforce Trends

Population

Washington County ranks 29th in area among Idaho's 44 counties. Its population began to decline in 1999 as some residents left to seek jobs in more diversified economies. But after the 2001 recession, the population began growing consistently, albeit slowly, into 2010. Since then the population began to decline again. In 2014, the county saw the first population increase since 2010, gaining 67. This year, the county continues to lose population again, losing 24 people over 2015.




Labor Force & Employment

With the exception of 2009, when it gained 276 people, Washington County's labor force has either declined or remained roughly stable over the past decade. Between 2014 and 2015, the labor force declined by 30 people to 4,562. The county's unemployment rate continued to decline from its peak in 2010 to 5.8 percent in 2014.

Washington County gained 17 covered jobs in 2015, driven by the private education and health services and information sectors. Almost all sectors gained at least a few jobs over the year. The only losing sectors were Agriculture, Trade, Transportation and Utilities, and Other Services.

For the decade though, the county is down 115




covered jobs. Manufacturing led the way, losing 88 jobs. Construction and Trade, Transportation and Utilities lost 46 jobs each. Over the decade, Agriculture and private education and health services were the top job gainers.

Per Capita Income & Employment

Washington County reported an increase of nearly \$300 in its per capita income in 2014, bringing its ranking to 22nd among the 44 counties.

Government, including public education, continued to make up the largest portion of nonfarm employment with 29 percent. Manufacturing was next with 21 percent followed by trade, utilities and transportation at 17 percent.
