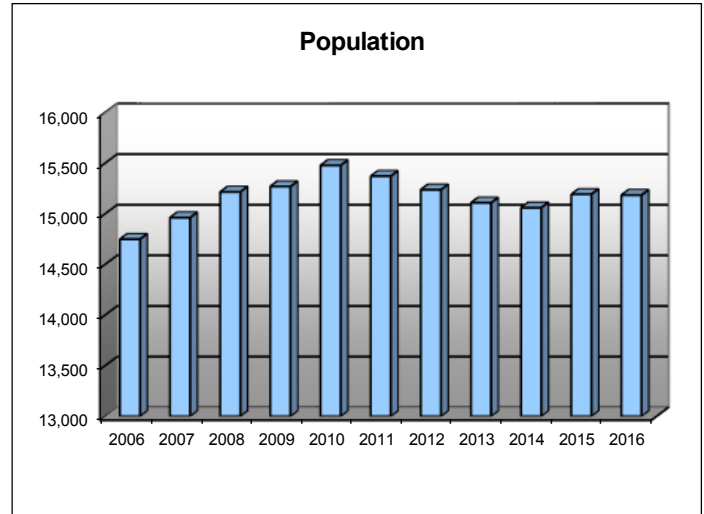

Workforce Trends

Population

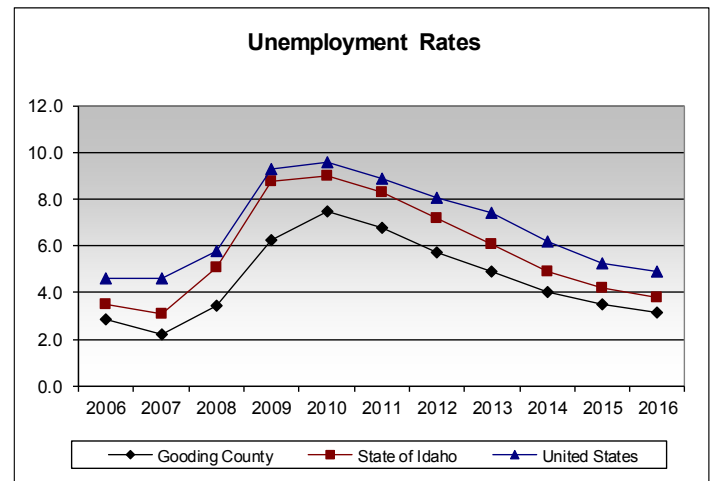
Gooding County's population of 15,185 in 2016 lost an iota of population, growing three percent since 2006. Restructuring at the Idaho School for the Deaf and Blind between 2003 and 2006 took its toll, as did the recession and low dairy prices in 2009. Gooding County is the state's dairy leader, but the explosive growth over the last 15 years was blunted by moratoria on dairies and feedlots. The industry has converted typically migrant, seasonal workers into permanent residents. The county seat and largest town is Gooding at 3,509 residents in 2015. Wendell, coined the Hub City due to its central location, is the second largest town at 2,744. Over half the county lives outside town borders. Despite the predominance of dairy, the county's agriculture is diverse raising specialty onions and beef cattle to being a national leader in trout. North Canyon Medical Center opened its new facility in 2010 in Gooding, expanding recently. Glanbia continues to grow its footprint in Gooding County, adding higher-skilled and better-paying jobs at its whey plant and acquiring a warehouse within the city of Gooding.



Labor Force & Employment

The civilian labor force has been steadily growing in Gooding County over the last decade from 6,600 in the late 1990s, peaking in 2007 at 8,800 then dropping to 8,000 in 2015 and 2016. The unemployment rate has fluctuated but continues to remain well below state and national rates. Those that live in Gooding tend to have established work or be retired.

Dairy and cheese processing plants provide stable year-round employment. The rapid growth in dairies has slowed in recent years as environmental concerns forced the Gooding County Commission to tighten standards for large livestock operators. Kieferbuilt Trailers started operations in 2004 and provided higher skilled jobs until it shut down during the recession. Its space was filled by Wel Companies, a logistics and warehousing company



which recently sold to Glanbia. Residents continue to commute to Blaine County providing higher-paying landscaping and construction services. These jobs were scarce in the economic downturn despite the needs of estates, second homes and hotels in Sun Valley and Ketchum. A growing charter school competes for students, drawing from the public school budget. Glanbia, with cheese and whey plants regionally located, is a large-scale buyer of milk and an innovative business leader in pre-treatment of its waste water.

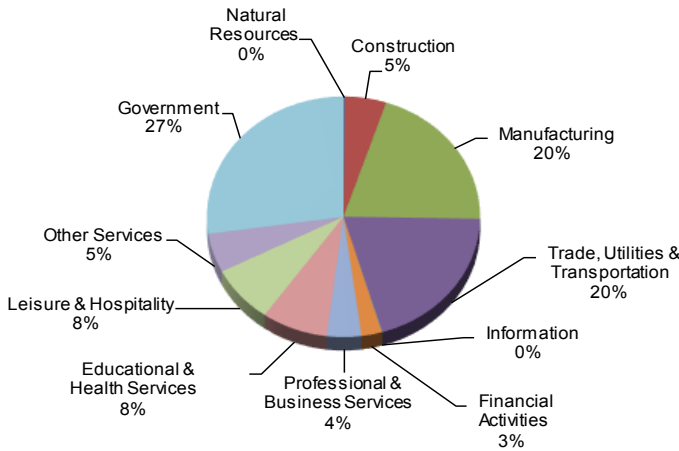

Wages & Income

Income generated from dairies combined with value-added manufacturing, along with crop and ag support industry have combined to surge Gooding County's growth in per capita income by 46 percent over the last decade. It is ranked 2nd among Idaho's 44 counties despite dropping 1 percent from 2015. A plummet of milk prices in 2009 plunged it to 29th place. Gooding's per capita income 134 percent of the state's average and 108 percent of the national per capita income.

Covered job growth was up 3.7 percent from 2015 to 2016 driven primarily by the agriculture sector with an increase of 165, 8.8 percent. Wages from 2015 have grown by 3.4 percent or \$1,105. Construction experienced the largest increase with a 12.3 percent growth, or \$3,469.
