



CIS – LICENSES AND MODULES

CIS is the next step in career development following CIS Junior. The system is an essential, proactive and participatory resource for engaging in life and career planning. Comparable and related information is linked in meaningful ways encouraging students to consider a full range of options in setting goals and developing plans for life after high school. CIS is the only source for current, comprehensive Idaho and national information to plan high school courses, prepare for postsecondary education and make informed career decisions.

CIS Basic License includes:

- More than 570 occupation descriptions.
- Extensive nationwide list of programs of study.
- Detailed information on state and national two- and four-year colleges, universities and other postsecondary institutions.
- Facts about all proprietary schools in Idaho.
- Detailed information on more than \$155 million worth of scholarship awards.
- Information files on how to pay for school, write resumes and perform well in interviews.
- Developmentally appropriate career and life-planning activities and lesson plans.
- Over 100 interactive lesson plans scope-and-sequenced and sortable by subject area, grade level, Common Core and more.

CIS Power License includes:

- Everything described in CIS Basic License.
- Several exploration tools including interest, skill and work values assessments in English and Spanish.
- Student/Client portfolios with such tools as course planners, checklists, personal learning plans, resume writers, postsecondary application trackers and assessment result reports.
- Site administration tools giving you the ability to track and manage student/client progress and graduation goals.

Optional Modules include: *

- Dependable Strengths – a six-step process that helps identify the unique combination of core skills, abilities, qualities and traits students enjoy using.
- IDEAS™ – a short interest inventory designed to be an introduction to career exploration.
- Peterson's Practice Test Packages – a variety of authentic academic and civil service tests to help students identify which skills or study areas need improvement.
