Migrant and seasonal farmworkers have access to many employment services at all Idaho Department of Labor's offices throughout the state, including:

- An online system to register for work, search for jobs, file complaints and apply for unemployment insurance benefits.
- Job referrals.
- Job search workshops available in Spanish as select offices.
- Career guidance.
- Job training information.
- Resource center with computers, resume templates, internet access, career planning software, Idaho's JobScape, newspapers, self-help books, videos, mail drop, fax, phones and copiers to use in job searches and unemployment insurance-related activities.
- Various forms and documents in English and Spanish.
- Information on community services.
- Labor market information.
- Workforce consultants.
- Interpretation services available if necessary.
